





JOIN US FOR OUR ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING LUNCH WILL BE PROVIDED

June 12, 2024, is the day for our Annual Membership Meeting. At this meeting, we will vote on three seats for the Board of Directors and two proposed Bylaw amendments.

Three candidates are running for those three seats on the Board. They include:

- Russ Ingram (Incumbent)
 - Philip Munger
- Dora Wheeler (Incumbent)

The Bylaw proposals on the ballot will include one that would extend the number of director term limits from two (2) three-year terms to three (3) three-year terms to increase continuity on the Board. It also adds a non-voting, ex-officio, one-year term for an outgoing director who was the President, to provide advice and counsel the Board on matters before it.

The second proposal resolves a potential scheduling conflict when the Special Board Meeting to elect Board Officers falls on a federal holiday and the Center is closed. As currently written, the Special Board Meeting is to be held on the first Monday following the Annual Membership Meeting. In the past, that has fallen on a federal holiday. To resolve the potential conflict, this amendment would allow the Special Board meeting to be held any day in June before the end of the month.

Voting Methods

- In person at the Annual Membership Meeting on June 12
- By early walk-in voting beginning at 9:00 a.m. on the day of the Meeting
- By absentee voting on the Friday, Monday and Tuesday immediately preceding the June Membership Meeting
 - By US Mail if you request a ballot from the Administration Office

Finally, if you are a member and attend the Annual Membership Meeting, you will be entered to win one of two \$50 dollar gift cards.
