

# From the Gift Shop

Alaska got lucky when Coyote Trail Farm and Fiber Mill came into existence. The brainchild of retiree Kate Wattum of Fairbanks, the Mill is the only outlet in the state of Alaska for turning animal fiber into finished yarn. The mill produces both undyed and intense dyed yarns. Formerly, those shearing sheep, alpacas, llamas and the like, as well as those harvesting musk ox fiber (kiviut), were forced to spend hundreds of dollars shipping their raw product “outside” for processing. The process was expensive with little control or oversight. The Fairbanks Fiber Mill has changed all of that. With a local well run operation, farmers are now producing much more Alaskan woolen yarn than in the past. Matsu Senior Center Gift Shop is proud to announce that we have become the exclusive Anchorage area distributor for the mill’s exquisite yarns. Much of the yarn is harvested right here in the valley from merino sheep. There is also a collection of qiviut (musk ox yarn) sold in one and two ounce skeins in the gift shop. Both natural and dyed hues, as well as blended qiviut yarns of several types are available. Qiviut, the downy soft under wool of the musk ox is extraordinarily lightweight and is eight times warmer than woolen fiber. It is one of the finest natural fibers known to man and is highly sought after. The gift shop collection of woolen yarns includes a wide color palate from brilliant melon to deep indigo and many intervening shades. Its time to start some handmade Christmas gifts. Come in and make your choices soon.

Classy Glass Expressions has a long presence in the gift shop with fashion accessories that never fail to please the discerning eye. This season, designer Vicki Randolph, has outdone herself with a rugged bear claw neck piece with an ivory and exotic wood claw cap. The bear claw comes from the front paw of a very large Kodiak brown bear. It was shot by Randolph’s father in the late ‘60’s on Afognak Island. Randolph’s maternal ancestors were originally from a village on the island which was destroyed during the 1964 earthquake. The hunting expedition was memorable. After shooting and prepping one of the largest bears he had ever brought down, Randolph senior and hunting partners returned to a camp completely destroyed. A marauding bear not only decimated the camp, but destroyed the trophy bear hide dragging it and burying it near camp. Only the head and paws of the giant Kodiak could be salvaged. Randolph’s father had the head mounted, bookends made of the hind paws and the front claws became ashtrays. Following her father’s death, Vicki Randolph had Anchorage artist Jason Levra extract and stabilize the claws from the ashtrays. She then designed and made the necklace. According to Randolph, “I’ve always been opposed to trophy hunting, so I see a great deal of what I call “poetic justice” in this story. The great bear’s spirit lives on through his magnificent claws and through this story. This necklace honors the spirit of the great Taquka’aq who once lived on a beautiful island called Afognak.” Vicki Randolph is a 6th generation native Alaskan of the Aleutian people of Kodiak Island.

Tees (long and short sleeved), sweatshirts and bomber hats from Rolling Boxcar are now available at the gift shop. The organization celebrates the contributions of military personnel through the use of a highway-adapted vintage C-119 known as the “Flying Boxcar.” The 60 foot aircraft fuselage, minus wings, is mounted on a 40 foot bus chassis and will be used as a traveling Alaska military museum, performance venue and mobile classroom when it is completed. Purchase of Rolling Boxcar memorabilia helps to support the organization’s mission and ongoing activities, so pick up yours soon.

Finally, don’t miss the collection of Rhonda Scott Alaska art cards that have just arrived in the gift shop. According to Scott, a great day is one in which she has either dirt or paint on her hands. A life-long Alaskan, Scott spent many happy hours of her life gardening, and began her art career at the age of fifty. She produces a wide variety of iconic Alaskan art. At the gift shop there are cardinals in the snow, an upbeat rendering of the Anchorage Visitor Center cabin and a variety of Alaskan mountain views. These blank cards are perfect for sending to friends and family who live outside of Alaska or to frame and hang on your walls.

There's always something new at the gift shop, so visit us often. You'll be glad you did!




